Advice for the end of your semester from upper years

"Get at least 6 hours of sleep daily, eat balanced meals, and stay active. Exercise provides a productive break and can reduce stress while boosting focus."

"Use tools like Notion or Google Tasks to map out your exam schedule and to-do list. Write everything down to visualize your workload, and remember to schedule breaks to avoid burnout."

"Avoid burnout by incorporating 20–30 minute breaks every two hours. Use the time to unwind, walk, or talk to friends preparing for the same exams." "If an exam doesn't go as planned, focus on the next one. Mistakes can't be undone, but a forward-looking mindset can help you succeed in what's ahead."

"Begin with the most important or professor-highlighted topics, focusing on past questions and review lectures. Teach peers after studying for yourself to reinforce concepts."

"If faced with a tough question, tackle what you know first, then revisit challenging ones. Writing down everything you recall can help jog your memory and make connections."
